SUNDAY, FEBRUARY 23rd, 2025: THE LAST JUDGMENT

Epistle: 1 Corinthians 8:8-9:2 Gospel: Matthew 25:31-46 Troparia: p 42 (Tone 2), p 75 (Last Judgment)

SUNDAY OF THE LAST JUDGMENT is a parabolic glimpse at the Last Day from our Lord in the Gospel of St. Matthew. Christ speaks to two groups of people: one referred to as sheep, the other as goats. Sheep and goats both serve a noble purpose on their own merit but in this example, their difference in their inheritance couldn't be more stark. The sheep show themselves to be obedient and considerate to our Lord and "even the least" of their brethren; feeding the hungry, giving drink to the thirsty, clothing the naked, visiting the sick and the imprisoned. The goats, who struggle against any shepherd, fail to do the same and, to their bewilderment, fail to see how they failed their Lord. So much does our Lord identify with His children, that whatever happens to them happens to Him. O Lord, save us!

The Board of Trustees and Officers of St. Nicholas of Myra Orthodox Church are submitting the following proposal for discussion at the annual meeting to be held on Sunday, February 9, 2025 February 23, 2025.

Proposal:

The Board, Officers and 100th Anniversary Committee have been preparing for our centennial celebration in November. At a recent meeting, a suggestion was made to clean the stain glass windows within the church proper. After considerable discussion, the board agreed to solicit quotes from companies who specifically perform church stain glass window repair, maintenance and restoration in the New York City vicinity. We received and evaluated several quotes before agreeing to present to the parish a proposal to clean and repair the 4 large stain glass windows and two smaller windows above the altar boy room and sacristy. The New Jersey based company who provided this proposal gave us a quote of \$13,159.

The Board and Officers are prepared to discuss this proposal in more detail and answer questions at the annual meeting. If the proposal proceeds to a parish vote and receives approval, the work would be completed prior to our 100th anniversary celebration.



OVER THE PAST TWO WEEKS, THE PARISH RAISED \$315 TOWARDS THE FLEMINGTON AREA FOOD PANTRY, BETWEEN SPECIAL COLLECTIONS & DONATIONS.

THE FOLLOWING IS WRITTEN BY ELIZABETH KRZYZANOWSKI, PARISH LIAISON TO THE FOOD PANTRY:

"The Flemington Area Food Pantry provides food and personal care items to people in Hunterdon County who are food insecure. Food insecurity is a national problem. In Hunterdon County, of 126,000 residents, an estimated 5,000 have income below the poverty level. Many of these residents, including children and infants, don't get enough to eat without some form of assistance. The Flemington Area Food Pantry depends on the generosity of the Hunterdon County community for its very existence. Without donations of food and funds, the Pantry would not exist. More than 80% of Pantry income is derived from contributions of monetary donations and groceries. The Pantry provides supplemental groceries to

approximately 1,600 income qualified Hunterdon County families. Pantry clients are often underemployed hardworking adults, veterans, families with children, and seniors who simply cannot make ends meet and who go without food for several meals, or sometimes several days at a time. These people are your friends and neighbors. Some have lost jobs, and some are homeless. They are of all nationalities and ethnic backgrounds, but have one thing in common: they don't have the resources to buy the food they need to subsist."

Suggested donations: Canned chicken, Canned fruit in juice, Scalloped or au gratin potato mix, Pasta sauce Muffin mix, Ketchup, Diapers (size 5 and 6), Baby wipes, & Sanitary pads
